2023 School Contributions and Charges

Financial support provided by parents plays a significant role in the provision of resources that extend the school's capacity to add value to the learning experiences of our students. 1. Voluntary Contributions

2. Charges for Extra Cost Optional Components

3. Provision of Items for Personal Use

The purchase of items that a student requires every day at school in order to fully participate in the learning activities. The list of items for personal use will vary from student to student. For example: stationery items, calculator, scrapbooks, etc. Some items, such as calculators and headphones, may be used in following years. Other items, such as pens, pencils, glue, may need to be replenished throughout the year. A list of recommended items is provided for each child in the form of a 'book' list. Parents may purchase the items from their chosen retailer or use the school's nominated supplier, Campion Education.
